TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITION

In 1794, a young Irishwoman befriended two widows aboard ship while emigrating to America. They bought a house in Philadelphia and began to live a community life under the direction of a priest. Soon they relocated to Washington. There, the “pious ladies,” as the neighbors called them, were asked by their priest friend, by then the president of Georgetown University, to begin a religious community. In 1799 they established a branch of the Visitation Order founded by Saint Jane de Chantal and Saint Francis de Sales in the 1620s.

The unique vision of this order followed a sensible routine, less arduous and more flexible than most traditions, and also accepted widows and older women. Amazingly, this American outpost of the Visitation began without reference to the “rule” of the Order. Most of the European convents had been lost under the “reign of terror,” and the rules and customs of the community could not be obtained. A copy of the rule was discovered in 1812, and in 1816 the pope officially established the monastery. By then, some French nuns had regrouped, and they sent a habit and cross to be copied. (No religious wore the habit in public in the United States until after the Civil War.) From the beginning, the Georgetown nuns had an educational mission, even though they discovered in the “rule” that such work was officially off-limits for the contemplative life. In America, the nuns depended on a school for their livelihood, so the rule was adapted. Today, the Academy of the Visitation is a thriving example of excellence in Catholic education, and the adjacent monastery is the oldest monastic foundation in the original thirteen United States.

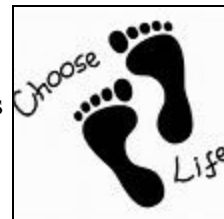


HUNGER DOESN'T VACATION

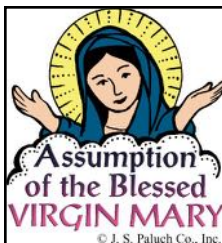

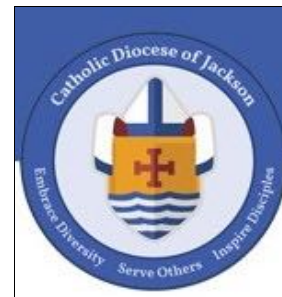

ST. JOHN BERCHMANS

St. John Berchmans, the eldest son of John Charles (a shoemaker) and Elizabeth Berchmans, was born in 1599 at Diest in Belgium. He was named after St. John the Baptist. Attracted to the religious life at an early age, he became a servant at age 13 in the household of a Cathedral canon at Malines.

In 1616 he entered the Jesuit novitiate against the wishes of his father. He was acclaimed for his diligence and piety, always striving for perfection.

After his first vows in 1618, he went to Antwerp to study philosophy and was later selected to participate in discussions of philosophy. Gifted, he exercised remarkable insight and clarity in his philosophic discussions. Unfortunately, he developed Roman fever, and his health rapidly deteriorated. He died at age 22 in 1621 when Philip Charles, Duke of Aarschat, petitioned Pope Gregory to begin his beatification process. He was beatified in 1865 and canonized in 1888.

The Academy of the Sacred Heart at Grand Coteau, Louisiana, claims the only shrine of the exact location of a miracle. When the Society of the Sacred Heart opened a boys school at Grand Coteau in 2006, the order named it in honor of St. John Berchmans.

Although he died young, St. John Berchmans is honored in many ways. Belgium issued a stamp with his image in 1965. The St. John Berchmans Society with many chapters across the country honors altar servers. A parish and cathedral in Shreveport, Louisiana, bear his name. Many churches, schools, and colleges are named for him throughout the world.

The patron saint of altar boys, his feast day is November 26.

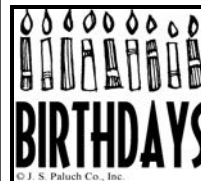
