

PLANNING A CATHOLIC FUNERAL

The Catholic funeral differs in many ways from a funeral in the secular world. While non-Catholics use funerals as opportunities to celebrate the life of the deceased, in a Catholic funeral the Church fulfills the spiritual work of mercy to pray for the dead. We know in faith that our earthly life is not the end, but is merely a preparation for eternal life — a life which we hope to share with Christ Jesus the Lord. For this reason, we have a duty to our deceased loved ones to pray for them and beg for the mercy of God, that all their sins will be forgiven and washed away, and that they will be raised to the eternal joy of heaven.

The elements chosen for a Catholic funeral reflect our belief and aid us by encouraging us to pray for our deceased loved one. The options given below are provided as a guide in selecting appropriate texts for the Catholic funeral Mass:

RITE I: The Vigil for the Deceased (Wake) or Visitation

Because funerals usually occur during work days when people are not always able to attend, we recommend a visitation take place the night before. This may occur at the Basilica, and in this situation the body or remains of the deceased may be left overnight in the Basilica which will be locked and secure. (This is to avoid any additional cost to transfer the body to and from the funeral home).

Alternatively, the family may choose to hold visitation before the funeral, or at the funeral home. In this case, a formal Vigil is not held, but the Priest is available to come and pray with the family or offer the Rosary.

RITE II: The Funeral Mass

Sections made for the Funeral Mass are meant to highlight the Church's teaching about death and our hope for resurrection. They are not meant to reflect the particular features, tastes, or preferences of the deceased. Readings and Hymns may be chosen from the lists provided. Other recommendations for musical selections may be directed to the Organist, but not all recomendations may be accepted either because of their suitability to the Funeral Mass, or because of the capability of musicans.
