## The Mother Church of Mississippi Catholicism

The Catholic presence in Natchez traces back to 1682 when explorer Robert de la Salle's expedition celebrated the first documented Mass just south of the city. A formal French Catholic parish was founded in 1722, and later, under Spanish rule, a church was built on Commerce Street in 1778.

From 1798 to 1839, the Catholics of Natchez faithfully sustained their community without the presence of a resident priest. In 1837, the Diocese of Natchez—the first in Mississippi—was established. Bishop John J. Chanche arrived in 1841 and laid the cornerstone for a new cathedral in 1842. Though unfinished, the church was dedicated on Christmas Day 1843 and completed over the next 40 years. Consecrated in 1886, the Cathedral of Our Lady of Sorrows served the diocese until 1977 and is now honored as a minor basilica and a treasured Catholic landmark in the South, being known as the Mother Church of Mississippi Catholicism.



Saint Mary Basilica is more than an architectural treasure—it is a spiritual home, a center of sacramental life, and a witness to the enduring Catholic faith in the South. As the Mother Church of Mississippi Catholicism, it holds a place of profound significance for generations of the faithful. But time and the elements have taken their toll.

# Phase 1 COMPREHENSIVE EXTERIOR RESTORATION \$2,600,000 investment

This project aims to preserve both the beauty and the structural integrity of the Basilica by addressing the full exterior:

- Repointing and restoration of all masonry
- Paint removal and installation of breathable waterproof coatings on concrete elements
- Restoration of historic wood windows
- New laminated protective glass and venting systems
- Application of clear waterproof sealant over restored masonry





Today, the beauty of our liturgical music is at risk, as our 17-year-old digital organ has recently undergone multiple repairs. To preserve the fullness of sacred music at the Basilica, we will install a new pipe organ. This instrument will:


- Offer a timeless investment in worship, as a pipe organ can serve the Basilica and its community for multiple generations
- Recreate the historic façade of the Basilica's original organ's design, complementing the Gothic architectural style with custom wood and pipe details
- Provide a versatile and durable instrument suitable for both sacred music and public performances

# Phase 3 – Stretch Goal: SAINT MARY BASILICA ENDOWMENT

The final phase of the *Restoring the Sacred* Capital Campaign seeks to establish an endowment that will increase the long-term care and vitality of the Basilica. This permanent fund will provide ongoing resources for maintenance, preservation, and sacred programming, safeguarding the beauty and mission of Saint Mary Basilica for future generations.
